General Information

The AgriBusiness Association of Kentucky (ABAK), the Agribusiness Council of Indiana (ACI), and the Kentucky CCA Program invite you to attend the 26th Annual Kentuckiana Crop Production Seminar scheduled for December 1-2, 2009 at the Evansville Airport Marriott in Evansville, Indiana. The Kentuckiana Seminar has been organized by representatives from Purdue University and the University of Kentucky, along with members of the ACI, ABAK and the Kentucky CCA Program.

AGENDA: The Seminar begins the morning of Tuesday, December 1 and runs until late afternoon on Wednesday, December 2. All program times are Central Standard Time Zone. **Please note that lunch will be “on your own.” This is a change from recent years and the registration fees have been adjusted to reflect that attendees will be responsible for their own lunch. There is a restaurant in the hotel and many restaurant choices in the vicinity of the hotel.**

REGISTRATION: In order to accommodate the needs of attendees, the Kentuckiana Seminar is divided into four different Workshops. Attendees have the option of attending only the Workshop(s) they need to satisfy their CEU requirements and/or time constraints. When registering, attendees should indicate which workshops they will be attending and pay the accompanying fee. Discounts apply for those attending multiple workshops. Attendees need not attend consecutive workshops to receive the discount. For example, an attendee wanting to attend only the morning sessions on both days simply marks those two workshops on the registration form and is still eligible for the two-workshop discount fee.

There are opportunities to earn CEUs for Certified Crop Advisers as well as Indiana and Kentucky pesticide credits. Approval is pending for Indiana and Kentucky pesticide credits as well as CCA CEUs. Please look at the different Workshop choices to determine the number of CEUs offered in each. Individual sign-in sheets will be posted in each session on the day of the meeting.
